Important information about a UNICEF Walk

K.J. Ståhlbergin koulu is organising a UNICEF Walk on **16.9.2024**. UNICEF Walk is an exercise event organised by schools, where pupils can show their support for the implementation of the rights of the child in developing countries.

This year, UNICEF Walks are raising funds for Nepal so that children in poor areas that have suffered from earthquakes will be able to go to school and learn.

UNICEF Walks in a nutshell



Before a UNICEF walk, pupils find themselves a sponsor. The sponsor can be any adult or a local company, for example.



On the day of the UNICEF Walk, pupils collect stickers for their walking achievements.



The sponsor promises to donate a certain sum of money for each sticker that the pupil collects on their UNICEF Walk.



After the UNICEF Walk, the pupil shows their sponsor the stickers collected in their UNICEF walk passport. The sponsor donates the promised amount.

It is also possible to participate in a UNICEF Walk without a sponsor.

As a UNICEF Walk sponsor, you are encouraging your local UNICEF Walker to get moving and supporting children's school attendance in Nepal.

Learning for children in Nepal is hampered by poverty, recurring earthquakes and child marriage. Many children drop out of school and education for girls is not appreciated. Sometimes the road to school is long and dangerous. Many schools lack teaching materials.

UNICEF's work is based on the UN's Convention on the Rights of the Child. Using the funds raised, UNICEF and partners will:

- Promote school attendance and quality education for children in poor areas that have suffered from earthquakes
- Act as an expert to influence decision-makers in order to make Nepal's schools safe for children.
- Support teacher training in Nepal.
